The current economic situation has revealed the high degree to which correlation among risks has increased; as we gain deeper insight and as more information is available regarding these interconnections, global leaders need to improve their understanding of these relationships to implement better prevention and mitigation strategies for dealing with an increasingly complex global risk landscape.
